Bill 32 is unconstitutional. CUPE is working with other unions to challenge the bill in court. But the case may take years.

"Fightback" is the term we are using to challenge Bill 32 and the Kenney government. Our legal challenge is part of this effort. As are tactics we use to live with Bill 32 in the meantime.

But the Kenney government has to be defeated in 2023. To that end, CUPE is engaging in the largest campaign in our history. Our campaign is aimed at educating and engaging voters about the damage Kenney is doing to public services, pensions, health care and education.
